Who is North Rampart Main Street Inc.?

NRMSI is a non-profit organization dedicated to revitalizing North Rampart Street between Canal Street and Esplanade Avenue. It is a certified "Urban Main Street" through Louisiana Main Street and the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

Since its inception in 2006, North Rampart Main Street, Inc. (NRMSI) has strived to promote, build, and encourage businesses and individuals to get involved in North Rampart's rebuild/rebirth since Katrina. Measuring success, in the national economic arena today, requires more commitment from those that actually work, shop and live on North Rampart.

Why is North Rampart Street Important?

Although currently underutilized, North Rampart is historically and geographically one of the most important streets in New Orleans. It serves as a border street for both the French Quarter and Tremé, two of New Orleans' most beloved neighborhoods. North Rampart is uniquely positioned to serve both residents and visitors and to provide an easily accessible historic setting for an authentic exchange of traditional goods, services, and experiences.

NRMSI advocates for greater funding, both public and private, for the beautification and safety of the neighborhood, as well as promoting and providing free assistance and information to those who might wish to relocate to this neighborhood.

It is our purpose to see the economic corridor returned to its original place in the city's economic history - a place where natives and locals could provide their goods and services to the citizenry and our visiting tourists and friends.
